Subject Specific Vocabulary	
software	Programs on a computer or tablet that help it do things, like games or writing tools.
search engine	A website you use to find information on the internet by typing words into a search box.
PowerPoint	A computer program used to make slideshows with pictures and words to show information.
sharing	Sending or giving files, pictures, or information to other people using a computer or the internet.
presenting	Showing your work or ideas to other people, often using slides, pictures, or talking.
algorithm	A set of step-by-step instructions to solve a problem or complete a task.
filter	A tool that blocks or removes things you don't want, like unsafe websites or unwanted messages.
routers	A device that connects computers and devices to the internet.
Wifi	A way for devices like tablets, phones, and laptops to connect to the internet without wires.

S IS FOR SAFE
Never give out personal information to strangers on the internet. Personal information includes things like your home address and your birthday.

Never ever meet up with a stranger you have met online unless a parent or guardian has said it is ok and is present. Never, never, never, never, never.

A IS FOR ACCEPTING
Don't open emails from people you don't know, they could contain viruses. If you get a strange email from a friend and you think they might have a virus make sure you let them know!

R IS FOR RELIABLE
Don't believe everything you read online, check your facts! Did you read it on a reliable website like the BBC? Are other websites saying the same thing? Does it tell you where they got the information from?

I IS FOR TELL
If you have an online safety problem, make sure you tell someone. Tell a parent, guardian, or teacher as soon you can.

Presentation
A visual way of displaying information to an audience that is clear and engaging. It can contain text, images, animation and videos.

Insert
Image, Text box, Audio, Video, Shape, Word art, Line

Media
Information in the form of words, sounds, numbers, images, or graphics in electronic, print or broadcast form.

Transition
Motion: None, Dissolve, Fade, Slide from right, Slide from left, Flip, Cube, Gallery

Animate
Appear/Disappear, Fade in/out, Fly in from left/right, Fly out to bottom/top, Zoom in/out, Spin

Presentation Title

Styles
Change the size, font alignment and colour of text, textboxes, shapes and lines.

Theme
Presentation Title
