	E- On <b>Maundy Thursday</b> Christians drank bread and wine to remember Jesus last supper.
	F- On <b>Good Friday</b> Christians attend Church and <b>fast</b> from some foods.
	G- On <b>Easter Sunday</b> Christians break Easter eggs to symbolize the empty <b>tomb</b> .
