	A – Physical features are natural features on the Earth’s surface, such as water, lakes, mountains and deserts.
	B – Human features refer to something that is built by humans and would not have existed in nature without humans. Features include anything from a house to a city, and all the related infrastructure such as roads, rails, canals.

	G - Fieldwork and geographical investigations are about finding out new things about people, places and environments.
	I - A town is bigger than a village with more houses (and people), schools and usually a train station.
	J- A village is a small settlement with some houses, shops and sometimes a small school. A town is bigger than a village with more houses (and people), schools and usually a train station. A city is often bigger than a town with lots of buildings close together, high populations and advanced transport systems.
	L - England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland make up the United Kingdom.
	M - Great Britain is part of the United Kingdom, Great Britain is an island (land surrounded entirely by water), Great Britain is made up of three countries: England, Scotland and Wales
	N - Wales is to the west of the UK and is surrounded by water on three sides. It has coasts, mountains and valleys.
	O - England is the largest country by land size and population. It has large cities such as London, Birmingham, Nottingham and Manchester.
	P - Aerial photographs are shown from above. Geographers use them to recognise landmarks and features.

Subject Specific Vocabulary

Human features	Features that are man made. These include houses, shops, and roads.
Physical features	Features that are natural. These include lakes, mountains and rivers.
Town	A built up area that is larger than a village, but smaller than a city. Towns have more shops, houses and usually a train station.
City	A city is larger than villages and towns. It is a built up area which often has a cathedral.
Village	A village is small area that has some houses, shops and sometimes a small school.
Aerial photographs	Aerial photographs are taken from above and look like a 'birds eye view'.
Fieldwork	An investigation that helps us find out new things.
