














Subject Specific Vocabulary	
budget	An awareness of how much money is incoming and how much money is being spent.
money	An exchange of coins or bank notes to pay for goods.
want	To be desirous of something goods/food/aspirations.
need	An item which a person is unable to live without.
income	The amount of money a person is paid by their career or job.
outgoings	The amount of money a person spends.
prioritise	To organise into which is the most to least important.
investment	The act of putting money, effort, time, etc. into something to make a profit or get an advantage or make more money.
interest	A fee paid for borrowing money/an amount of money given to the customer for saving.
bankrupt	Not being able to pay a fee owed.
