









Year One – RE: How and why do we celebrate sacred times?



Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Christmas	A Christian holiday to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
Easter	A Christian holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus.
Harvest	The celebration of the food that has been grown on God's land.
community	A group of people living in a particular area, who have things in common.
sacred	Connected with God.
faith	To have trust in God.
religion	The worship of God.
loyalty	Faithfulness or attachment to someone or something.
resurrection	Bringing someone back to life after they have died.

	Sticky knowledge
	Christian festivals include Christmas, Easter and Harvest.
	People celebrate in different ways including singing songs, ways of worship, stories, artefacts and eating special food associated with these celebrations.
	Christians believe Jesus' body was resurrected , meaning that there is eternal life after death.
	On Palm Sunday , Christians wave palm branches to remember Jesus' arrival.
	On Maundy Thursday , Christians drank bread and wine to remember Jesus last supper.
	On Good Friday , Christians attend Church and fast from some foods.
	On Easter Sunday , Christians break Easter eggs to symbolize the empty tomb .
