This is a geography-based enquiry, we want the children to have an understanding of our community whilst expanding our children's geographical knowledge of the United Kingdom. Throughout the term we will be learning about the physical and human features of both Pinxton and Nottingham and will know how to locate them on a map. We will be learning about the countries and the capital cities that make up the United Kingdom and how to use a compass. To support us with our learning we will be exploring the local area and taking a trip to Nottingham!

| | A – Physical features are natural features on the Earth's surface, such as water, lakes, mountains and deserts. |
